Welcome guide for students and participants with a disability





Who is the intended audience of this guide?

This booklet is written for anyone with a temporary or permanent disability, to inform them of the services available to them at each stage of their time at **emlyon** business school, from admission through to the search for an internship or a job.

The French Law of February 11, 2005 on the equal rights and opportunity, participation and citizenship of people with a disability defines disability as follows:

> "Within the meaning of this law, a disability is deemed to be any limitation of a person's activity or restriction of their participation in life in society in their environment because of a substantial, long-term or permanent deterioration in one or more of their physical, sensory, mental, cognitive or intellectual functions, a poly-disability or a debilitating health condition".

Our approach to disability at emlyon business school

The disability and accessibility provisions

The provisions are **open to the entire emlyon community**: students enrolled at the School or on an exchange program on our campuses, participants, members of staff and faculty.

They provide for:

- A dedicated team
- Awareness-raising sessions
- The coordination and training of a network of advisors among all the School's professional departments and associations.
- Membership of a dedicated network of partners

Personalized support:

The **Disability Unit's** work is totally confidential. Its **role** is to:

- Identify the needs of people with a disability and make sure their studies progress as smoothly as possible and that they settle into campus life at **emlyon** business school
- Suggest specific accommodations and address any accessibility issues by setting up individualized learning support
- Liaise with external partners in order to find solutions to compensate for the student's disability
- Liaise with the various departments at the School
- Help the student complete the administrative and academic formalities.

The Disability Unit, whose staff is based in Écully, works for all of the French campuses (Paris, Saint-Etienne and Écully) and is regularly present on all three sites.

Your admission

Please contact the Disability unit, as soon as possible, to send your assistance or support request while applying for eligibility (competitive entrance exam, file registration...) : <u>handicap@em-lyon.com</u>

- → If you are a student undertaking your initial training: once you have been admitted, please complete the health form and the information about your disability on our IAEL online platform so that you can receive appropriate guidance and support.
- → **If you are taking part in a continuing education program**: please contact the Disability Unit and your program coordinator.

Any information you provide will remain strictly confidential.

Your studies at the School

Obtaining accommodations

Once you are enrolled, prepare your arrival in advance by contacting the School's Disability Unit at: <u>handicap@em-lyon.com</u>.

You will be able to make an appointment with the Disability advisor for an initial needs assessment. If your situation requires medical supervision, the nurse or the doctor in the Disability Unit will also attend this interview. Any subsequent request for accommodation will be approved and certified by Dr. Bussière.

You will be asked to provide the following documents:

- Any recent medical records testifying to your medical condition: doctor's certificates, medical reports mentioning the accommodations, medical check-up results and/or speech therapist's reports, official recognition of disabled worker status, etc.
- Any educational support plans in place during your secondary education or previous higher education, such as the PAI, PPS or PAE in France.
- ✓ **Your MDPH registration number** or a statement certifying that you have registered with the MDPH (the Departmental Center for People with a Disability), if applicable.

Depending on your situation, you may qualify for certain specific accommodations to tuition methods, your timetable or exams.

The team is also there to offer advice, help you access course content and join in student life, and provide guidance and support with finding a job.

The possible accommodations:

- Adapted exam conditions: extra time (an additional one-third or one-half of the allotted time), separate exam room, use of your PC with your special software, etc.
- Modified curriculum: adapted timetable, support for your international project, etc.
- Tools to simplify access to campus facilities: elevator access card, key fobs for the parking lot, etc.
- Personal aid: note-taking, help with everyday life, etc.
- Help with completing administrative formalities with organizations such as the MDPH disability center, the Agefiph disabled workers agency, the Crous student services center, etc.

The Health & Wellbeing center

The Health & Wellbeing center by APICIL is a multi-campus space where students can find information, preventive healthcare, guidance and advice.

It is open:

- On the Ecully campus: every day except Wednesdays
- On the Paris and Saint-Étienne campuses: on Mondays and Thursdays

The Health & Wellbeing center:

- Offers the help of a nurse or a psychologist
- Runs **talks** and **workshops** on specific topics (mindfulness, nutrition, addictions, lifestyle factors, etc.)

The Health & Wellbeing team is there to help you, raise awareness of certain issues, inform you and question you about your behavior with regard to health and wellbeing.

- → The Disability Unit can help you apply to the MDPH (the Departmental Center for People with a Disability). You may then qualify for living allowances (subsidies for purchasing technical aids, employment of a carer, transport between home and university).

Sport

Ecully Campus:

The gymnasium and the dance studio are disabled-accessible. However, please note that the floor covering in the entrance area is not flat. The weights room and dojo are on the first floor and there is no step-free access.

Saint-Etienne campus:

The fitness center, weights room and dance studio have been refurbished and are now disabled accessible. Facilities include reserved showers and changing rooms. However, the openings to the toilets are difficult to grasp for wheelchair users.

Paris Campus:

The campus does not have indoor sporting facilities.

The majority of the outdoor facilities we use, whether public or private, meet accessibility standards.
